Standing Order

WHY GIVE?

As a Baptist church we are financially independent, which means that all the money needed for the day to day life of the church comes from within the church itself. We rely completely on the generous giving of those who are part of our church family.

The Bible contains countless examples of the people of God giving from what they have for God's purposes. In the Old Testament, this often takes the form of tithes, which were used to care for the poorest among them and also support the ministry of the priests (e.g. *Deut 14:22-29*). At special times of year, the people would bring additional offerings from their fields so that together they could celebrate God's goodness and blessing (e.g. *Num 29*).

In the New Testament, the new churches kept up with their responsibility to look after the poor (e.g. *Acts 4:34-35*), as well as supporting other churches (e.g. *1 Cor 16:1-2*) and those who had dedicated themselves to full-time 'ministry' (e.g. *Phil 4:16*). Again, this was done out of a recognition of God's goodness to them and a desire to see more people come to know God and experience His goodness for themselves.

When Jesus talks about giving he does so with the expectation that we already give. He doesn't

explicitly command us to give, because he assumes this is something that followers of God do anyway. Instead, he instructs us about the attitude we should have when we give - not boastfully or with a proud heart, but privately and sacrificially with a heart of compassion (*Matt 6:1 -4; Luke 21:1 -4*).

There is no stipulation on how much you should give. The apostle Paul suggests that all should give '...what they have decided in their heart to give' (*2 Cor 9:7*). In other words, it's between us and God. The starting point of the Old Testament tithes is 10% of what we have, but in some rather extreme examples Jesus asks some to give 100%! The amount is not as important as the attitude with which we give. We're instructed to give '...not reluctantly or under compulsion, for God loves a cheerful giver'. (*2 Cor 9:7*)

HOW WILL MY MONEY BE USED?

Money given to the church helps us to pay for a number of different things, including:

- The maintenance and upkeep of our church buildings, providing us with a space we can use for worship and other activities.
- Paying our minister(s) a stipend, which releases them to serve the church full-time.

- Supporting local mission and outreach initiatives e.g. Messy Church.
- Supporting the Baptist Union of Great Britain's Home Mission Scheme, which helps Baptist churches that are struggling financially.
- Supporting mission around the world through organisations like BMS World Mission, who are involved in all kinds of work including development, evangelism, church-planting, health, education and much more.
- Helping to fund the Baptist Union of Great Britain's national and regional resources, which in turn seek to help us in all aspects of our church life.
- Paying for administration costs such as insurance, license fees and so on.

HOW CAN I GIVE?

As part of our worship service each week we take up an offering, and many people choose to give to the church by putting cash or a cheque in the offering bag.
